Subject: EPA Approval of New DuPont Avaunt Label

EPA has recently approved the new DuPont(TM) Avaunt(R) insecticide label. This label adds 7 crop groups/subgroups plus some additional crops for a total of an additional 84 crops on the label.

The crop groups/subgroups added are:

1. brassica (cole) leafy vegetables,
2. cucurbit vegetables,
3. leafy green vegetables,
4. leafy petioles,
5. pome fruit,
6. stone fruit, and
7. tuberous & corm vegetables.

Additionally, the following additional crops are added:

1. cranberry,
2. grape,
3. mint,
4. okra,
5. Southern pea,
6. spinach,
7. New Zealand spinach,
8. vine spinach and amaranth.

This label has been submitted to all the states in which Avaunt is registered. Approval of this new label is pending in CA, HI and NY.

Use of this label is now permitted in the following states: AK, AL, AR, AZ, CO, CT, DC, DE, FL, GA, IA, ID, IL, IN, KS, KY, LA, MA, MD, ME, MI, MN, MO, MS, MT, NC, ND, NE, NH, NJ, NM, NV, OH, OK, OR, PA, PR, RI, SC, SD, TN, TX, UT, VA, VT, WA, WI, WV and WY.
